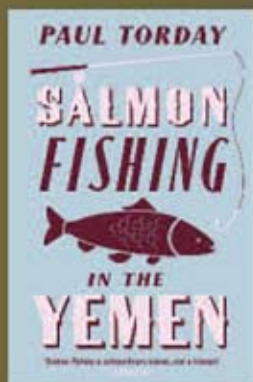

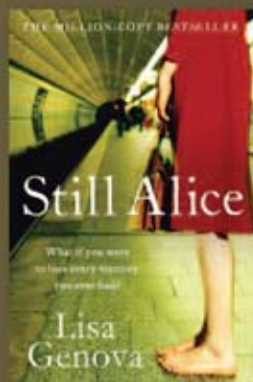




Salmon Fishing in the Yemen

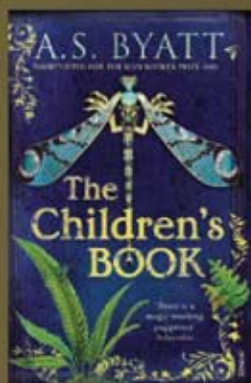
A sensitive, compassionate novel. Alice is at the peak of her career when diagnosed with Alzheimer's.

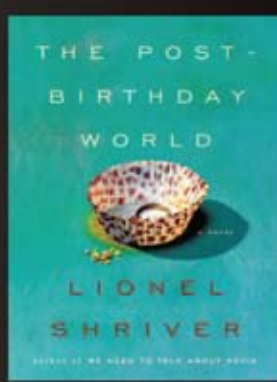

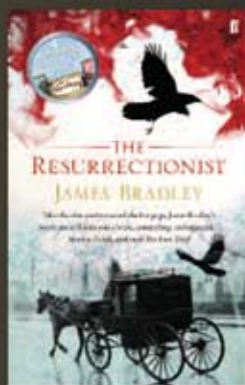

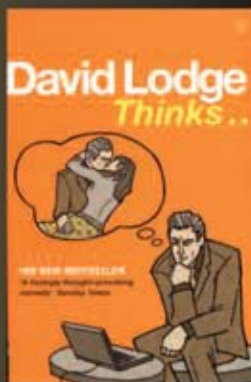
The Ugly Sister

Abi and Cleo are worlds apart in more than just looks. A book about the intricacy of relationships between family and friends.



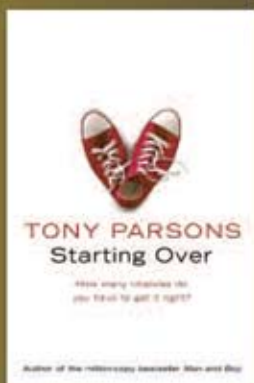
The Woman in the Fifth

Running away from a failed marriage and a dark scandal that ruined his career, on a bleak January morning, Harry Ricks arrives in Paris a broken man.



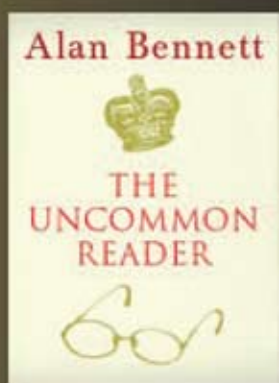
